CLASS NEWS

Class 1

This week in Class 1, we have been continuing our themes of Autumn/ All about me. In Literacy, the children have been writing stories based around 'Simon Sock' and writing recounts of our 'Outdoor Activities' this week. In Maths, we have been investigating 2D shapes, by identifying them, researching their properties and creating works of art with them. In History, we have been looking at which significant occasions we celebrate, both within our families and at school. In P.S.H.E, we have continued with our theme of self-regulation, learning how to identify feelings and how to moderate behaviour, both socially and emotionally. Finally, we had so much fun in the rain on Wednesday. First, the children took part in a leaf scavenger hunt, then tried to catch raindrops on their tongues. Next came Child Initiated time, making soup and potions in the mud kitchen, and designing a very challenging obstacle course. Finally, class puddle jumping!!! All the children were engaged in their learning, behaved wonderfully, and most of all, had fun! Have a great weekend everyone!

Class 2

Class 2 have been enjoying studying our new book, 'Greta and the giants', which is a story based on the climate change campaigns of Greta Thunberg. It is a really interesting story and it has promoted lots of discussion in class. We are working on Multiplication in our Maths work and we will move on to Division next week. We have been looking at different types of castles in our topic work and drawing some of their features. Mr. Henderson has continued teaching us how to play the ukelele and we are making slow but steady progress with it. We have been doing better with learning our spellings and times tables, with scores gradually improving generally, which is great to see. Well done Class 2!

Class 3

We have had another fantastic week in Class Three. The children have been responding to our class novel 'The Wolves in the Walls' and producing some excellent accounts of what is happening in the story. We have been looking at the relationship between division and multiplication in maths and are developing our understanding of this. Well done to everyone who made a Roman Shield at home and brought it into school. everyone had fun practising Roman formations on the yard, it was great fun. It was lovely to see you all on Parents' Evening. Have a great weekend everyone.

Class 4

This week, we have had an extremely busy week (I know I say this every week!). It was lovely to see you all during parents evening this week and have the opportunity to catch up about the progress of your child. Class 4 played a large role in our harvest song which we did as a whole school during Wednesday's harvest collective worship so thank you for your hard work! We have also taken part in open afternoon, our final swimming lesson of the term and ukulele lessons! In maths, we have been looking more at geometry and have looked at the properties of 3D shapes. We have also written newspaper articles in English and a monologue. In science, we have looked over our topic this half term about circulation and health and created mindmaps to consolidate understanding.
