Please read important details regarding change to the routine for dropping children off each day.

# **CLASS NEWS**

# Class 1

We have had another busy week in Class 1again this week!

As a class we celebrated 'Lunar New Year' and learned about customs and traditions from other cultures. We learned all about 'The Great Race', and how animals were chosen to represent different years in Chinese culture. Reception made their own play-dough, weighing ingredients, mixing, rolling, and eventually using it to make model animals and food for the 'Chinese Restaurant'. The children also performed a dragon dance, complete with musical accompaniment, to ward of bad luck and bring in the good! We have also been busy in other areas of the curriculum. In R.E, the children learned about 'Infant Baptism', and joining God's loving family. In History, we have carried on with our theme of 'Explorers', focusing on Christopher Columbus. In Science, we have been investigating animals, focusing on similarities and differences between animal groups. Lastly, in P.S.H.E, the children had to work together in small groups, to build the highest tower they could. Along with having lots of fun, vital life lessons in tolerance, co-operation and compromise were also learned. Have a great weekend everyone!

# Class 2

Wow! Another week has gone by! This week we have enjoyed making pinch pots in Art. We were all impressed with the care and detail we achieved. Next week we are looking forward to making clay tiles. In our History we are all getting really good at telling the story of the Fire of London-how it started and how it became so big; this week we learned about how historians know about it by looking at different sources of evidence. In our English we have tried to work out if we think Tuffy did kill Thumper (next door's rabbit). It was fun reading the rest of the story to find out! In maths, we are working on mental addition using different strategies and our knowledge of number bonds. We finished the week with our R.E. topic on Judaism and learned about Shabbat (the Sabbath day). We are looking forward to continuing to learn together next week.

# Class 3

We have had a great week in Class Three this week. We all had a great time at Forest Schools on Wednesday and enjoyed making shelters. Everyone worked well together and supported each other. Our work linked to the Lion, Witch and the Wardrobe has been really exciting. The children have been writing character profiles of the main characters and have enjoyed sharing these. In maths we have started to look at time. I am encouraging all the children to practise this skill at home by using different analogue and digital clocks to improve their understanding. # Class 4

Another busy week in class 4. In maths, we have been looking at multiplication and division methods and have looked at key terms such as multiple, factor, prime numbers, squared numbers and cubed numbers. In English, we have looked more at our class text and have completed monologues in the role of 'Buck'. We have also been lucky this week to see the installation of a new 'Barn Owl Box' which is situated on the top field. Thank you for providing suitable footwear. 
