## Class 1

We have had another busy week in Class 1 this week! Year 1 have all completed their reading assessments and should be very proud of their achievements. We have also been practising for our Christmas Concert, learning songs and carols. We have also begun our Christmas craft, starting with cards and then moving on next week, to gingerbread men and puppets in D.T. In Literacy, this week, the children have lots of opportunities to write, including in our role-play/ space station, in our Christmas Post Office, and in our phonic sessions. Reception have been learning the 'qu' sound, and have made a crown for a queen, out of clay. We were lucky to have a visit from 'Xplore' on Wednesday, as part of our topic on materials. The children thoroughly enjoyed it and were able to apply the knowledge and skills they had acquired earlier in the week. Well done children! Thank you to all parents who have sent in costumes. ## Class 2

Well, it's been an interesting week! We have been working hard to learn and practice our words and songs for the Christmas service. We have been making clocks and using them to help us tell the time. We need lots of practice at working out how many minutes past the hour have gone, and using the correct vocabulary for telling the time. In our Geography work we have been thinking about what the weather is like in the U.K. We have also been expressing preferences for our favourite types of weather. The most popular types seem to be hot sunny weather and snow! We really enjoyed our Science workshop on Thursday which showed us some amazing activities related to materials which are either solids, liquids and gases. There were many surprising facts and fascinating demonstrations which were a lot of fun!

## Class 3

Another very busy week has come to an end. The children greatly enjoyed the science workshop yesterday and carried out lots of exciting experiments and activities linked to our work on materials. Back in class we have been focusing on negative and positive numbers looking at number lines and identifying changes in temperature. In English we have looked at personification and this can help improve our poetry. The children have been asked to continue to learn their song words for the carol concert for homework over the weekend. Please remember costumes need to be in on Monday. ## Class 4

This week, we have had another very busy week! We have been learning more about 'The Jungle Book' and considered how Mowgli felt. In maths, we have continued our work on algebra. We have also looked more at micro:bits in our computing lesson this week and look forward to connecting them to our devices next week. We also thoroughly enjoyed our science workshops with staff from Xplore! Science Discovery Centre this week, looking at various properties of materials. Homework this week is to complete the times tables challenge in maths books and to write sentences including the spellings sent on Dojo.
