Ash Dieback which is a danger UK wide, has affected many Ash trees within the school grounds. Hamner Morris have therefore removed all such dangerous trees and branches around the grounds. Including by the steps and greenhouse. As a result the Forest School area is restored including some new log stools! One highlight for spectators was the most difficult tree to remove, situated between the demountables and the old School House garden. This was felled in stages by Harvey Morris, who left the school as a pupil about 8 years ago. It was so impressive to see his skills with dismantling the tree from top to bottom and ensuring no damage to the buildings. All left neat and tidy. Good to see a local man in a local job. And enjoying it!

CLASS NEWS

Class 1

It was lovely to welcome everyone back after the half-term break, ready to start our new topic 'Light And Dark'! We started the week by catching up with our talking partners and writing our half-term news. On Monday afternoon, the children learned all about 'Divali- The Festival of Lights', in R.E, and enjoyed the Story of Rama and Sita. On Tuesday, the children learned all about 'Bonfire Night', and created both 2D scenes, and 3D fireworks. Year 1 also sequenced pictures from 'The Gunpowder Plot'. On Thursday, we began our topic of 'Everyday Materials' in Science, identifying different materials and sorting them into groups. On Friday, we looked at an aerial photograph of Selattyn on Google Maps, and labelled different features found in the village, on a map. Finally, thank you to everyone who brought in clothes for outdoor learning this week! We had our messy/exploration session close to our classroom area on Wednesday, but we are hoping to utilise our lovely 'Forest School' area next week, weather permitting! Class 2

This week we have started work on our new book, 'Jemima Puddle-Duck'. It is a lovely story by Beatrix Potter and we are really enjoying it. In our Maths work we are looking at Fractions, focussing on finding halves and quarters of shapes and numbers. Our Geography topic this half-term is about hot and cold climates. This week we looked at the World's continents and identified them on a map. In French we were using a variety of greetings. Our Computing work is about programming and we started using instructions to control a 'robot'. We have a new set of spellings to learn for next week and we will be continuing with our times tables work, with a test every Friday.

Class 3

It was great to see everyone back in school after our half term break. The children were keen to start their learning again and soon got to grips with our new maths topic looking at two dimensional shape and symmetry. Everyone has enthusiastically worked on a range of activities and have learnt a number of new terms to describe shape and their properties. In English we have been looking at tricky spellings and developing strategies for self checking our work carefully. We are looking forward to starting our work on poetry in the coming days. Next Friday we are heading to Chester for our Roman trip which should a great day out. Have a lovely weekend everybody.

Class 4

A very busy week this week. I have had various meetings/courses this week so I have been really impressed to hear how well the class have got on in my absence. In maths, we have been busy looking at fractions, completing numerous activities such as ordering fractions, comparing fractions, looking at equivalent fractions and recognising mixed numbers and improper fractions. We have also written a recount in English, based on our adventures during half term. We have also done lots of worked linked to Remembrance Day. This week, homework will be placed on Dojo to access along with spellings. Have a lovely weekend.
