CLASS NEWS

Class 1

This week in Class 1, we have begun our theme of 'Light and Dark'. In Literacy, we have started our class text ' The Night Box' by Louise Greig, looking at nocturnal animals, and coming up with items that we would put in our own night box. We have also continued with our phonics programme, with Reception completing Set 1 of Phase 3, and Year 1 learning different ways to make the 'oa' sound in Phase 5. In Numeracy, we have been practising counting in 2's and 10's. We have used ten frames, number lines, and had lots of opportunity to learn through practical activities, including trips on Mrs. Henders' imaginary bus!! In Science, we have continued learning about materials, distinguishing between names of objects and the material they are made out of. In P.S.H.E, the children discussed bedtime routines, and how important it is for our health, to get the right amount of sleep. Lastly, thank you for all your support today with 'Children in Need'. We discussed with the children, what the charity was trying to achieve, and they all seemed very proud that they were able to contribute to such a worthy cause. Class 2

Class 2 have worked hard this week on improving the quality of our presentation and the accuracy of our spelling in our writing. It has been great to see how far we have come since the beginning of term. We have been encouraging each other and sharing lots of good ideas in our Literacy work and in our topics. Our ukelele playing is improving week by week and Mr. Henderson is very pleased with the progress everyone is making. We have been enjoying our P.E. Lessons with Mr. Graham and we are developing our listening skills when following instructions as well as our coordination and stamina. We have also been enjoying the mild weather when playing outside, although we are expecting much colder weather next week, so we need to make sure we have extra layers to keep us warm for the rest of the term!

Class 3


We have had another brilliant week in Class Three! We have been developing our understanding of measuring length in maths and have been measuring and converting between different units of length. We have been focusing on aspects of what makes effective and memorable poetry in English. We have been learning about assonance and similes with some very good work produced. On Monday we took part in the national two minute silence for Armistice Day with everyone being very respectful. We have had a brilliant day at the Roman Museum in Chester today! We learnt lots of important facts, marched like a soldier and visited the amphitheatre. A great time was had by all. Have a lovely weekend!

Class 4

Another very busy week in Class 2. We have been looking at percentages in maths this week, considering the relationship between percentages, decimals and fractions. In English, we have started to read our text for the half term, 'The Jungle Book'. We have also looked at the characters introduced so far and the setting itself. In science, we looked at sieving this week in our mixtures and separations topic, completing a little experiment with sand and various materials. We have a very busy couple of weeks ahead in the lead up to Christmas. I have spoken to the class about parts in our Christmas production and will send scripts home asap. We will practise as much as we can in school but if spoken parts can be practised at home, it would be greatly appreciated. Please feel free to ask if there are any questions. 
